# **Meeting Expectations – Clarity is needed**

- All of the business processes of the Boards have not yet been clearly articulated and documented.
- Because of this, all parties industry, stakeholders, government agencies – continue to hold their own expectations as to "the way things should be".
- When expectations are not met, parties are confused and frustrated.

- review existing policies and procedures throughout the Mackenzie Valley, and,
- where necessary, develop new policies and procedures and document them.
- Established in January 2008
- Made up of staff of all <u>four</u> Boards.





Working Group Products Will Provide Different Levels of Guidance

1. Policies (eg. Water and Effluent Quality Management Policy)

# 2. Guidelines (eg. Closure and Reclamation Plan Guidelines)

#### 3. Standards (eg. Data Submission Standards)



- Proponents should know what to expect before they apply
- Reviewers and stakeholders will understand the ways in which they can make meaningful contributions in the Board decision-making process
- Having fully documented policies and procedures will increase Board capacity overall


# Progress
